Urban Redevelopment Act

Partially Funded

Now what, what are my options?



Scale Down

Scale down the project to match funding by trimming the components of your project.

EXAMPLES

Services: Reduce the number of Participants or the area

Non-profit XYZ applied for a grant to service 30 participants in 10 counties. Since they were partially funded, they reduced the number of counties to 5 and kept the number of participants to 30.

Housing: Reducing the number of units

City ABC applied for a housing grant to build 25 housing units but shifted the amount to 15 after being partially funded.

Note: Make sure the scope of work is still the same.



Phased Approach

Approach Project in Phases

- Identify which phases of your project the grant will be supporting
- Explore project funding possibilities

EXAMPLE: Cornhusker Park is creating a new park recreation area. This will take 3 years and \$1,000,000. I received a \$100,000. How can I make this happen?

Phase One: Design, Preparing Land, Study, purchase playground equipment

Phase Two: Purchase the remaining playground equipment and apply for alternate Funding

Alternate Funding

Bank Loans

Bank loans are frequently utilized by small businesses as a popular method of raising funds, and in many instances, they serve as an excellent means of obtaining financing. Two primary types of loans are offered by banks: secured and unsecured loans.

Government Grants and Small Business Administration (SBA) Loans

Government grants are funds that are given out by the federal, state, or local governments specifically for business operations. Although the application process can be complicated and requires much research, these grants usually have fewer restrictions than bank loans. Furthermore, the amount received from a grant can be paid, making it an ideal choice for those who want to start their own business without taking on debt.

Alternate Funding

Partner with another grant recipient for possibility of subaward

Bank loans are frequently utilized by small businesses as a popular method of raising funds, and in many instances, they serve as an excellent means of obtaining financing. Two primary types of loans are offered by banks: secured and unsecured loans.

Angel Investors

An angel investor provides initial seed money for startup businesses, usually in exchange for ownership equity in the company. The angel investor may be involved in a series of projects on a purely professional basis or may be found among an entrepreneur's family and friends. The investor's involvement may be a one-time infusion of seed money or an ongoing injection of cash to get a product to market. Angel investors aren't usually in the loan business. They're putting money into an idea they like, with the expectation of a reward only if and when the business takes off.
