
TOTAL POPULATION, 2022

The total population of the region is 495,430. The largest county is Lancaster, followed by Cass, Saunders, and Gage.




POPULATION CHANGE 2010 TO 2022


The southern counties in the region have experienced population loss, while the northern counties have gained population.

POPULATION CHANGE BY PLACE 2022 TO 2023



Across all counties, the largest age group, as a percentage of the population, is 18 to 64.




POPULATION BY AGE BY REGION, 2022


NET COUNTY-TO-COUNTY MIGRATION, 2018 TO 2022

As a general trend, Nebraskans are leaving non-metro counties and moving to metro counties.



NET DOMESTIC MIGRATION, 2018 TO 2022

Once in metro counties, Nebraskans are more likely to move to other states. This trend is less notable in the Southeast Region, where many people are both leaving for and coming from other states.




NET COUNTY-TO-COUNTY BY AGE, 2022

Lancaster gains a significant population among 18 to 19-year-olds and 20 to 24-year-olds (not pictured). All other county-to-county movements in the region, across all age groups, are minor, which contrasts with other regions.




NET DOMESTIC MIGRATION BY AGE, 2022

The contrast between positive net domestic migration for 20 to 24-year-olds and net negative domestic migration for 25 to 29-year-olds in Lancaster County suggests that the region is seen as lacking workforce opportunities for college graduates.




NET DOMESTIC MIGRATION BY AGE, 2022

Domestic migration usually lessens with age, especially in rural counties. However, in the Southeast Region migration continues after age 50, indicating the area's potential to attract retirees.



PERCENT FOREIGN BORN, 2022


The Southeast Region, like much of the state, is not particularly diverse, but several counties have a high percentage of the population that is foreign-born.


EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT, 2022


Lancaster County has the highest percentage of bachelor's degrees among those aged 25 and older. In contrast, most people in other counties have completed high school and some college without earning a degree, although many counties exceed the state average for associate degrees.

The number of high school graduates is consistent in recent years. In 2021, 4,822 students graduated.


POST-SECONDARY PERSISTENCE RATES BY REGION, 2019, 2020, 2021


POST-SECONDARY GRADUATION RATES, 2020

TALENT RETENTION RATES, 2019, 2020, AND 2021


Talent retention by county in the region is high, but it includes individuals retained anywhere in the state.


LABOR FORCE PARTICIPATION RATES, 2022

Labor force participation rates are high in the region and statewide. However, Johnson County has the lowest labor force participation rate in the state.




UNEMPLOYMENT RATES, 2022


CLASS OF WORKER, 2022

Most workers in the Southeast Region are employed by private companies.




EMPLOYED IN OCCUPATIONS, 2022




TOTAL ESTABLISHMENTS






VACANT HOUSING UNITS, 2022

The rental market is robust in the Southeast Region compared to other regions, driven by Lancaster County.




MEDIAN HOUSING AGE AND MEDIAN YEAR OWNERS AND RENTERS MOVED IN BY REGION, 2022


MEDIAN VALUE OF OWNER-OCCUPIED HOUSING UNITS, 2022

PERCENTAGE AND NUMBER OF HOUSING COST BURDENED, 2022


Housing cost burdened refers to households that are paying 30% or more of their income on housing. Despite lower housing values in the southern counties of the region, many are still housing cost burdened, a function of lower income. Also, renters are more likely to be housing cost burdened.

In the region, there are 34,589 children under the age of 6, with the majority having both parents in the labor force.


PUBLIC PRE-K PROGRAMS BY REGION, 2023/2024




