**About NDOs**

NDOs can assist a local government in the management of a revolving loan fund, and NDOs offer related administrative services. **NDOs listed are in Good Standing (as of June 4, 2019) with the Nebraska Secretary of State. NDOs are designated as "Active" by DED through June 30, 2021.**

A Non-profit Development Organization (NDO) is a non-profit association or corporation organized under State law to engage in community economic development activities. The NDO enters into an agreement with a local government (a village, city or county) and the DED to act as a sub-recipient of CDBG grants. If a local government wishes to make a loan to a business, the funds can be contractually sub-granted to a NDO, which will make the loan to the business. The Business will be required to achieve a National Objective. If the repayment of that loan is made to the nonprofit organization (NDO) and the nonprofit retains the repayments for further use, repayments are not considered program income (provided the National Objective is met); subsequent loans by the nonprofit entity using those funds do not have to meet any Federal requirements (the "de-federalizing process"). The NDO would then administer the Revolving Loan Fund (RLF) resulting from those repayments in accordance with the terms of their Re-Use Plan which is approved by the DED.
