








Regional Map of Nebraska



The Governor's Office, Nebraska Chamber of Commerce & Industry, and Nebraska Department of Economic Development are dedicated to the success of the 6 Regions, One Nebraska initiative and actively looking to enlist partners in the venture.

The State has made an initial financial investment, matched by private dollars, to establish each regional team. The investment is helping to fund the salary of a full-time Regional Navigator in each region who will work alongside Co-Chairs to engage area partners. The investment will also provide financial incentive for initial regional projects in one of the following areas:

- Resident Recruitment
- Youth Engagement
- Entrepreneurship
- Technology
- Infrastructure
- Selected Regional Project

Governor Jim Pillen will meet with the work team of each region twice annually for work sessions. Each session will include a presentation of data to inform regional decision-making. Each region will also conduct asset mapping to identify the strengths it can draw on to drive growth. The goal of the 6 Regions, One Nebraska initiative is to catalyze cooperation among communities so that regional partnerships become the norm for how Nebraska pursues economic development.
