
Housing Resilience Planning (HRP)

CDBG-DR Housing Resilience Planning

The Housing Resilience Planning (HRP) program supports the development of plans related to housing recovery, housing resilience, and affordable housing that reduce hazard vulnerability. The overarching goal of the program is to promote comprehensive community resilience. The program will be conducted in three (3) phases:

- Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO). On June 20, 2024, DED issued a NOFO to the public. As described in the NOFO, an overview webinar was held on July 9, 2024.
- **2. Applicant Selection.** DED reviews all applications, prioritizing them by:
 - a. The project service area has a population that is greater than 51% Low-to-Moderate Income (LMI) persons.
 - The project area experienced flooding in the HUD-defined Most Impacted and Distressed (MID) area.



*The map above indicates HUD-defined MID areas

3. Plan Development. Selected applicants will become *Subrecipients*, and they will conduct the planning process and develop a housing plan.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

All Applicants must be located within or among the HUD- or State- defined MID areas, including:

- Dodge County,
- Douglas County,
- Sarpy County, or
- Counties with a Federal Declaration (DR-4420)

Applicants must fall under one of the following eligibility categories:

- Counties:
- Municipalities;
- Education Institutions; and
- Economic Development Districts

WHAT ACTIVITIES ARE ELIGIBLE UNDER THE PROGRAM?

Planning activities **focused on reducing flood vulnerability** and at least one of the following:

- Housing recovery;
- Housing resilience; or
- Affordable housing
